Creek and Project Updates

Chalet Creek – planting work continues on Fran Robertson's property and we are expecting our first chum adult returns this year.

Hagan/KENNES Creek – We are still looking for a volunteer to conduct maintenance on the signs in Centennial Park. Please call Ian or Francesca if you can spare a few hours for this project. The District of Central Saanich will be active clearing and cleaning ditches this early fall – our staff has liaised with their staff on these projects. A lot of garbage will be removed from Graham Creek just south of Stelly's X Road and north of Centennial Park.

Reay (Kelset) Creek – the Victoria Airport Authority has been diligently removing historically contaminated soils in and around the headwaters of Kelset Creek: http://www.bclocalnews.com/vancouver_island_south/peninsulanewsreview/news/54637727.html Hopefully we will see coho returns in Kelset Creek this fall! We are giving away a free Peninsula Streams ball cap to the first confirmed sighting of an adult coho there.

Tetayut (Sandhill) Creek – With the help of new volunteer David Lawrie, P.Eng. and the team of



Royal Roads University Environmental Science undergrads, we performed tests to determine if water from a pump on Tetayut Creek could be diverted upstream to increase flow through the Adam Kerr Park section of the creek. The tests worked, so we are now moving ahead with the flow supplementation part of the restoration project. In support of this project, we've recently held a community meeting to discuss the project, a work party to roll up 700 feet of pipe (thank you to our volunteers!), and a creek walk on the Tsawout First Nation Reserve (see photo to the left, taken by volunteer Jim Kirby). All three events were extremely well attended and we believe this will engender the rejuvenation of the Friends of Tetayut Creek group. Although delayed by weather early in September, the Adam Kerr Park restoration is still planned to be undertaken the week of September 21st.


Tod Creek – significant planning progress has been made on the Tod Flats project located behind the Red Barn Market. The Friends of Tod Creek Watershed have been working with the landowners, TLC, Saanich Municipality, DFO and others. On June 30th a design charrette was held with the stakeholders and Tom Biebighauser, a wetland designer with the US Forest Service. The results of this planning exercise combined with some research will be presented this fall as a framework design. It is expected to include permanent and ephemeral ponds, a relocated stream



channel and raised farming areas. For more information on this exciting project, please contact Mary Haig-Brown at 250-479-8801.

Tseycum Creek - the District of North Saanich is considering building a stormwater detention pond/channel to alleviate flooding in the Munro/Wilson Roads area.

Fry Releases – Chalet Creek received 500 chum fry from Deep Cove School as well as 30,000 from Goldstream Hatchery. Reay Creek will receive coho pre-smolts this fall...look for an email notice about this release.





Environmental Education Program – We are gearing up for the fall phase of the 2008/09 program which includes the **Alder Seedling Planting Project** financially supported by the Peninsula Co-op. The Gr. 3 students of the participating schools will be returning the red alders that they grew over the summer to be planted at various restoration sites on the Peninsula.
