RAIN GARDENS



Summer 2024 has been a vibrant season for our <u>Rain Gardens for Headwaters Program</u>, with three new gardens established in the Cecelia and Bowker Creek Watersheds.

The Parkdale Rain Garden now features hundreds of newly planted native species that will thrive and mature over the coming months and years. Thank you to the Parkdale Community and the Pacific Salmon Foundation for their funding of this project.

At Oak Bay High School, two rain gardens are already working to filter runoff from the parking lot and turf field, with plans to plant them this fall alongside students and the Friends of Bowker Creek. A huge thank you to all our partners and volunteers who made these projects a reality.







Speaking of rain gardens! We want to thank Justin Budyk, Environmental Stewardship Coordinator, for his leadership of the Rain Gardens for Headwaters Program, and our Stewardship Programs. COLQUITZ UPDATE



The in-stream restoration work of the Gabo Creek restoration project is complete! This summer, we worked alongside Saanich Parks, and Saanich Public Works to restore more than 200 meters of habitat, for the Coho salmon and Cutthroat trout that live in this Colquitz tributary. Riparian restoration continues, with native plantings taking place this fall.







British Columbia Salmon Restoration and Innovation Fund (BC - SRIF)

Another exciting development in the Colquitz: The installation of a PIT tag antenna array into the bed of the Colquitz River, which will detect PIT (Passive Integrated Transponder) tagged salmon as they swim overhead, recording their individual tag ID and the date and time. The data collected from this array will be crucial for furthering our understanding of the migration patterns, timings, and survivability of salmonids within the watershed. MILLSTREAM CREEK



Our in-stream restoration work in Millstream Creek is complete! Volunteers gathered at Cedar Vale Park North to build a riffle and add spawning gravel to the creek. This hands-on effort involved lifting, shoveling, and rolling rock, all of which contributed significantly to the health of the creek. PSS staff also secured a large cedar stump in the creek which will provide important rearing habitat for the salmonids. Thank you to everyone who participated and made this project possible.







TETAYUT CREEK



Our in-stream restoration work at Tetayut Creek is complete! Volunteers worked diligently to enhance rearing habitat for salmonids via judicious habitat boulder placements. They were also hard at work continuing ongoing riparian restoration efforts to remove invasive English Ivy. The previously cleared spaces are already seeing a return of native species, including trailing blackberry, Maple, stinging nettle, and June plum. Thank you to our funders and partners! A special thank you to Tsawout Fisheries for their support with this work.









KENNES (HAGAN BIGHT) BEACH CLEAN



This August, we teamed up with Tsartlip First Nation and Pacifica Paddle for a beach clean at KENNES (Hagan Bight). Tackling the problem from land and sea allowed us to recover 770kg (1698 lbs) of debris that was polluting the near shore environment. Thank you to all the eager participants for your hard work, Tsartlip First Nation for having us, and Central Saanich for helping with disposal!










GREEN CRAB MONITORING



For the past 3 months, PSS staff and volunteers have been monitoring for the invasive European Green Crab (EGC) in Millstream Estuary and the Gorge Waterway.

In response to the detection of EGC by our friends at the Gorge Waterway Action Society earlier in August, we worked alongside Pacific Salmon Foundation, Fisheries and Oceans Canada, and Coastal Restoration Society for a 3-day response trapping event. Stay tuned for updates, as the Gorge Waterway undergoes aggressive trapping and removal procedures.







Our last monitoring event will take place in Millstream Estuary on September 16th and 17th. We are looking for more volunteers to help sample!
