SUMMER RESTORATION



Craigflower Tidal Marsh Restoration



The tidal marsh restoration project at View Royal Park is nearly complete. The project is building on efforts to exclude geese from Craigflower Estuary and restore vital habitat for rearing juvenile salmon and wildlife. Volunteers have planted over 4,000 marsh and riparian species.

Gabo Creek Restoration

Peninsula Streams and the District of Saanich are collaborating to restore riparian and in-stream habitat in Gabo Creek, a salmon-bearing tributary of the Colquitz River. This summer, the project team is restoring a 300m stretch of the Creek, to enhance channel capacity and habitat for coho and trout fry and to improve spawning conditions, while bolstering the channel's resilience to floods and sedimentation.

GREEN CRAB MONITORING



First spotted on the west coast of Vancouver Island in the late 90s, European green crab are a hardy, highly-adaptable invasive species of shore crab that have quickly become **one of the top 10 most invasive marine species in the world**.

This summer, Peninsula Streams continues to conduct early detection monitoring for European green crab at two sites (Millstream Estuary and a second location to be announced).
