The KENNES Watershed Restoration Project

10,000+ m²

The KENNES Watershed Restoration Project is a multi-phase initiative led by Tsartlip First Nation at MÁWUEĆ, a 78-hectare property on their territory. It aims to restore streams, wetlands, riparian zones, and Garry oak meadows to support coastal cutthroat trout, strengthen biodiversity and water quality, build climate resilience, and revitalize WŚÁNEĆ cultural practices through community-driven stewardship.
